

First U-U Church Service, Panel Discussion to Focus on Marriage Equality March 29th

Ken Mogill, an attorney on the April DeBoer/Jayne Rowse legal team, will present the message during the 11 am service at First Unitarian-Universalist Church March 29th. He will also be a panelist in a 12:30 pm discussion following the service. Mogill's message, "Reflections on the Struggle for Marriage Equality" is billed as a personal examination of what marriage is and how the DeBoer case has affected people's views of marriage as a matter of law and social/religious conceptions. The church is adjacent to Wayne State University at Cass and Forest.

The post-service panel discussion and refreshments are sponsored by *Michigan for Marriage*, a statewide grassroots public education campaign to build support for marriage equality. Other panelists are Andre Gilford II, a graduate of the LGBT Detroit leadership academy; and Gina Calcagno, Campaign Director of Michigan for Marriage.

Mogill is a Detroit-area attorney and adjunct professor at Wayne State University Law School who has been involved in civil rights issues for over 40 years. For the past three years he has been representing DeBoer and Rowse and their children in their challenge to Michigan's exclusion of same-sex couples from the freedom to marry.
