In context of today's topic, this familiar song offers a fair amount of irony considering that the Edelweiss flower is white, grows on high mountains, and is illegal to pick as a protected species. However, in the Sound of Music, the edelweiss flower serves a metaphor for $-$ and goodbye to $-$ Austria, which was being annexed by the Nazis.
