Policies and Procedures ...

So, You've Been Wondering About UU Detroit's Policies and Procedures?

Featured policy and procedure of the month: EMEAC Board Representative

In June 2016, your Board of Trustees approved a <u>Policies and Procedures Manual</u>. The need for a manual became apparent from several different sources as diverse as the Planning Committee to our staff, from individual congregants to the Board itself. The P&P may be found on the first page of our website, 1stuu.org. Click on any title in the Table of Contents in the manual to go directly to that policy.

POLICY STATEMENT: Selection process and policies for UU Detroit's Congregational Representative to the Board of the East Michigan Environmental Action Council.

RATIONALE OR BACKGROUND: Pursuant to ¶10 of the May 25, 2011 Memorandum of Understanding donating UU Detroit's property to EMEAC, UU Detroit shall have a Congregational representative on the Board of EMEAC.

The procedures set out for selection of the UU Detroit representative to EMEAC's board are straightforward. They have been refined by agreement between EMEAC and UU Detroit.

The UU Detroit Board of Trustees will select potential candidates for Congregational Representative. Once candidates are identified, they are presented to EMEAC for its selection. The UU Detroit Board will formally appoint the person chosen by EMEAC. If there is a vacancy, the UU Detroit Board will follow this same process to appoint a new Congregational Representative.

The term is from the date of the appointment until notified by EMEAC of a necessary change, or until the position is vacated, or the UU Detroit Board of Trustees feels a new Congregational Representative is needed.

To represent UU Detroit on EMEAC's board, you must have been a member of UU Detroit for at least two years prior to the appointment, as membership is defined in Article III of the by-laws of the Church. The policy sets out requirements which, if not met, would result in revocation of the appointment.

The policy also requires that, in order to effectively represent UU Detroit, the Congregational Representative meet with the UU Detroit Board President, or the full Board of Trustees, to discuss issues — at least quarterly or whenever important issues arise — and that regular written reports be provided to the UU Detroit Board.

We're dedicated to our relationship with EMEAC. Our current Congregational Representative on the EMEAC Board, **Lencha Acker**, has served for several years. Thank you, Lencha!
