## Policies and Procedures ...

#### So, You've Been Wondering About UU Detroit's Policies and Procedures?

Featured policy and procedures of the month: Marketing & Public Relations

In June 2016, your Board of Trustees approved a <u>Policies and Procedures Manual</u>. The need for a manual became apparent from sources as diverse as the Planning Committee to our staff, from individual congregants to the Board itself. The P&P may be found on the first page of our website, 1stuu.org. Click on any title in the Table of Contents in the manual to go directly to that policy.

We feature a summary of a P&P every month in the newsletter so you may have a chance to know how UU Detroit operates! "POLICY STATEMENT: For our 'public face' to be consistent and effective, we need to establish graphic and marketing guidelines for conveying information about UU Detroit. Guidelines covering information to the general population, standard methods of branding, messaging, marketing, and press releases will be developed and followed by all members."

In 2016 when creating UU Detroit policies and procedures, our marketing and public relations efforts lacked clarity, consistency, processes, and user-friendliness. It was felt our congregation needed a branding effort to attract new members, promote our social justice activities, and improve our outreach efforts.

To address this, the board called for an *ad hoc* committee to create branding, messaging, and press release standards and outlets. A committee will form when necessary to create publicity for events, etc. The policy states that all marketing activities will be consistent with Unitarian Universalist principles.

External brochures or other marketing material must be approved by the *ad hoc* marketing committee chair or the Board President prior to release.

Staff responsible for internal communications, and the Newsletter Editor, are responsible to ensure that orders of service and the newsletter follow marketing guidelines and approved branding and graphic standards.

As part of our publicity efforts, a media contact list has been created and is available for use by the *ad hoc* committee or any other persons designated by the Board.

To begin consistent messaging, at the May 15, 2016 Annual Congregational Meeting, a list of the 19 different acronyms (!) found in various print and online resources of the church was presented to the congregation. After considerable discussion, it was decided to use "UU Detroit" going forward.

We don't know by what nicknames our forerunners, the First Congregational Unitarian Society — organized 1850 — or the Church of Our Father (Unitarian-Universalist) — organized 1879 may have called themselves, but UU Detroit seems to provide important information for the 21st century: we're UUs in Detroit!
